## MEET OUR SPEAKERS



### **Tanya Street**

Tanya Gould-Street, a survivor of domestic sex trafficking, child pornography, sexual abuse as a minor, and controlling relationships, is the founder of Identifiable Me. The nonprofit organization is dedicated to strengthening the emotional and mental health of victims of trafficking and other related sexual violence and moving them towards self-discovery and their life's purpose.

Years after being forced to drop out of school by her trafficker, she went back to college and earned her B.A.Sc. in Communications in 2015. Tanya now serves as a mentor, consultant, advisor, trainer and speaker on topics relating to her story. She has trained and presented trafficking awareness programs to over 150 organizations nationally and internationally.

Tanya currently serves on the Children's Hospital of the Kings and Daughters Advisory Board (on Commercial Sexual Exploitation – CSEC), as well as the Advisory Boards of Beloved Haven and Street Ransom two NGOs working to stop trafficking. She is an active member for the National Survivor Network. She is a consultant to Global Centurion, CHKD, DHS Blue Campaign, Safe House Project, OVC TTAC, Department of State TIP office, and Task Force implemented by the Attorney General office in the Hampton Roads region of VA. Tanya was appointed by President Trump to the U.S. Human Trafficking Advisory Council in 2018

### **Dr. Hugh Hanlin, Ph.D., HSPP, CSAYC**

Dr. Hanlin, Ph.D., HSPP is a licensed psychologist, certified in Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy and is credentialed in working with sexually maladaptive and traumatized youth. Dr. Hanlin received his Doctoral Degree in Psychology from Indiana State University and has over 35 years of clinical and administrative experience specific to sexual trauma and more than 10-years' experience working with survivors of human trafficking. He has provided consultation for the Indiana Department of Child Services with standard practice development for trafficked youth and participation in the Marion County Task Force on Sexual Abuse. He has authored a number of publications and is a well-renowned speaker both locally and nationally. Dr. Hanlin is currently a psychologist with Ascent 121, providing psychological testing, community training, program development and clinical team supervision.
